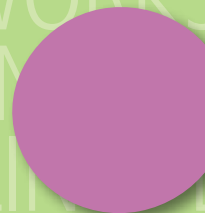
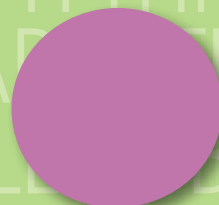
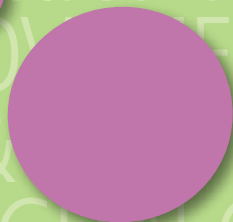

CLASS REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Online

Automatically enroll in Maryland Hall classes at marylandhall.org

In Person

- The main office at Maryland Hall is open Monday through Friday from 9 am until 5pm. Please use our online registration form or walk-in procedure.
- Students may not attend class unless tuition has been paid in full.
- All payments for tuition and fees must be made to Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts.

Class Cancellation

If a class fails to draw sufficient enrollment by the registration deadline, it may be canceled. The registration deadline is the day prior to the start of the class. To help ensure that your class will not be canceled, please register early.

FEES

Tuition as specified per class. Maryland Hall does not pro-rate classes.

REGISTRATION FEE

- \$10. Students who take more than one class per semester will pay the registration fee only once. Registration fees are non-refundable, unless the class is canceled due to insufficient enrollment.
- Materials fees are to be paid to the instructor (unless otherwise noted) on the first day of class.
- A membership fee of \$25 (individual) or \$50 (family) entitles those who join to a members' discount on class tuitions. Membership fees are renewable each year.

Late Fee

Registration after the published start date of the class will result in a late fee of an additional \$10.

Withdrawal and Refunds

If you need to withdraw from a class, please do so as soon as possible. Refunds are generally processed within 2 weeks of the request. (See **Note Below**)

- Refunds will be processed based on the following schedule:
 - 100% for notification received at least 5 working days prior to the start of the class
 - 80% prior to the second class meeting
 - 50% prior to the third class meeting
 - No refunds will be granted after the class has met three times.
- NOTE: There is a \$5 service charge for all refunds except refunds for canceled classes. Membership, registration fee, late fee, and materials fees are non-refundable. Tuition fees and registration fees are refunded only for canceled classes. Maryland Hall reserves the right to charge \$35 for all checks that are returned due to insufficient funds.

PICK UP & DROP OFF POLICY

Parents/caregivers of children under the age of 12 are required to escort their children to each class and sign in their child. At the conclusion of each class, parents/caregivers must come to the classroom and sign out for child pick up. Special pick-up arrangements (adults other than parent or primary caregiver on occasion) must be communicated directly to the teacher prior to pick up time for that class.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

- If Anne Arundel County Public Schools are closed all day, then Maryland Hall will NOT have classes.
- If Anne Arundel County Public Schools are open one or two hours late, then morning classes at Maryland Hall are canceled.
- If Anne Arundel County Public Schools dismiss early, then after-noon and evening classes at Maryland Hall are canceled.
- If Anne Arundel County Public Schools are closed or dismiss early on Friday, then please call Maryland Hall for information regarding Saturday cancellations or listen to WNAV after 7:15am on the Saturday morning.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR POLICY

To ensure a pleasant artistic experience for all of our students, we ask that they uphold the following Student Behavior Policy:

- Students are expected to come prepared for and to participate in class.
- Students are expected to treat the faculty, building and fellow students with respect.
- Students are not allowed to possess or consume alcohol or controlled substances in or around the building.
- Smoking is prohibited inside the building.
- Students who are consistently disruptive during class time may be asked not to return by the instructor.

Artstart is a comprehensive multi-arts learning experience for young children. Kindermusik is the music component of Artstart. Kindermusik classes, for children ages birth through 5, are available for registration either as classes for music only or in combinations with classes that include art, pretend play, creative movement and discovery learning. All Artstart and Kindermusik classes employ a holistic and integrated approach to education through the arts. Artstart idealizes the delightful concept of "educare" – guiding the child as a whole person.

Peabody Preparatory 2011 Summer Course Schedule

The Peabody Preparatory has a two-fold mission. It offers gifted children and adolescents the opportunity to realize their highest potential as leaders of the next generation of performing artists. It also offers an education in music and dance (dance offered only at the Peabody downtown and Towson campuses) to all members of the community who desire it, regardless of age, professional intention or previous training. This dual mission is based upon the notion that every individual has the capacity for artistic expression at some appropriate level of understanding and skill. The Peabody Preparatory of the Peabody Institute in Baltimore, a division of Johns Hopkins University, has offered professional music and dance instruction for 150 years to students of all ages and levels of experience and ability. It is recognized internationally for its faculty excellence, quality instructional standards, innovative and challenging curriculum, model certificate programs, teacher training and community music engagement. Each year, the Peabody Preparatory enrolls over 2000 students through its Peabody (downtown) campus and branch locations in Annapolis, Howard County, and Towson, MD. The Annapolis campus, which offers music instruction, has been located at Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts since 1982.



Summer Session at the Peabody Preparatory in Annapolis

The summer session at Peabody Preparatory in Annapolis provides a unique environment for all students. Returning students are able to maintain the continuity of their musical studies, while new students are able to receive an introduction to the discipline of their choice. The Annapolis campus offers summer classes in early childhood, voice camp for middle to high school students, and individual instruction in flute, guitar, piano and voice. The Preparatory also provides students who wish to pursue offerings in specialized dance programs and string camps these opportunities at other select campuses. These single and multi-week sessions and camps offer intensive study within disciplines. The summer session of the Peabody Preparatory runs from **June 20 to August 1** with make-up days **August 2-8**, if needed. Registration begins **April 1, 2011**. All programs run during the regular session dates unless otherwise specified.

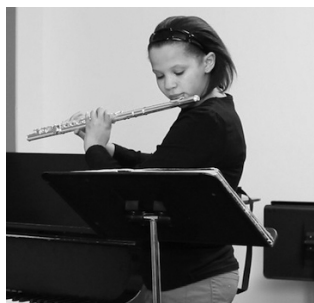

Individual Instruction:



Private lessons are available to children and adults of all experience levels – from beginners through the most advanced levels of study. Lessons are scheduled on an individual basis and are contingent upon teacher availability. Students enrolling in individual instruction are required to have a practice instrument available. Lessons are available in the following disciplines at the Annapolis campus: piano, guitar, voice and flute. Group classes in early childhood, guitar and voice are offered for instruction at the Annapolis campus. Students who wish to study other instruments, take dance classes or have individual instruction at a different time other than those available at Annapolis, please contact the Peabody campus of the Preparatory for further information at **410-234-4630**. Placement, Registration and Payment:

Full instructions are available online to assist you through the registration process. **Full payment is required at time of online registration.** Upon receipt of the student's online registration and tuition payment, students new to private lessons at the Preparatory will be contacted by the Annapolis campus coordinator to schedule a placement interview. Placement interviews for new students will be held at the Peabody (downtown) campus. New students are placed on a first come, first served basis. Should a placement be unobtainable, a full refund will be issued. EARLY CHILDHOOD MUSIC

Peabody's Early Childhood Music Department has enjoyed a rich and long tradition of providing exceptional music education for thousands of young children. Our philosophy is simple: to have children along with their parents and caregivers begin to experience and enjoy the gift of music making.

- Music for Babies and Toddlers (Ages 2–23 months)
- Music for Young Children (Ages 2–4 years)
- Music for Young Singers & Movers (Ages 4–6 years)



GUITAR

The Guitar Department offers individual instruction in classical guitar for students from ages 9 to adults. Group classes are available in both the fall and spring semesters for children and adults of all levels of musical experience and ability; Pre-Twinkle Guitar, a Suzuki-based program, is also available for very young children during the fall and spring semesters.

PIANO

Traditional piano individual instruction is offered at the Annapolis campus for all ages and levels of musical experience and ability. Peabody's Young Pianists (PYP—a Suzuki-based program), recommended to introduce very young students to the piano, is offered at the Peabody (downtown) and Towson campuses only in the fall and spring semesters. It is mandatory that students have a piano in their home on which to practice. While acoustical piano is preferred, a full-sized electronic keyboard is acceptable for the first year of study.

VOICE



The Voice Department offers individual instruction in the summer session. Group classes are also offered in the fall and spring semesters. In individual instruction, students concentrate on vocal technique and learn repertoire (mostly classical) in English and other languages. Group classes provide a supportive environment where students can acquire skills to provide a smooth transition into private voice lessons as the voice matures (about age 13).

Summer Camp for Singers – June 20-24, 2011

A one-week camp program (for middle and high school students) designed to nurture the young singer's ability to perform through the exploration of voice, repertoire, piano, acting, stage movement and makeup – (application deadline May 2, 2011). 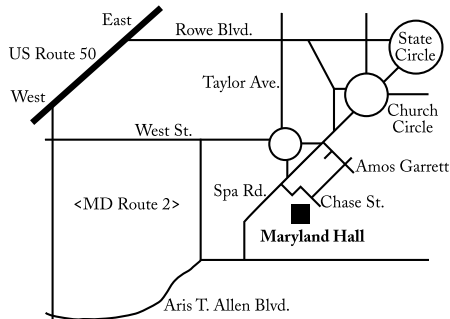
